



Connecting, Strengthening and Scaling Food Supply Chains in the Northwest and Rocky Mountain Region

Co-led by Colorado State University and Oregon State University, the Northwest and Rocky Mountain Regional Food Business Center works across the western states of Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, and Wyoming. **The Center supports farm, ranch and food businesses, as well as broader food supply chain enterprises through:**

- Technical assistance programs, curricula and one-on-one business support
- Capacity building through direct investments in projects, as well as professional development for regional food system leaders and innovators
- Coordination via strategic sharing of resources and coordinated action across the region, and between USDA and regional stakeholders





The Center provides foundational business development support for small and mid-sized farm and food businesses participating in local and regional food sectors, **focusing on these four high priority areas**:

- 1. Supporting meat supply chains that respond more nimbly to changes in demand or supply
- 2. Assisting food entrepreneurs in successfully entering local, regional or national markets
- 3. Expanding and diversifying markets for climate resilient agricultural products
- 4. Supporting right-sized, appropriately targeted investment in food value chain infrastructure to enhance business success and long-term viability

The Northwest and Rocky Mountain Regional Food Business Center is a node for the region's small and mid-tier food and farm businesses and local and regional food sector development initiatives by supporting cross-regional collaboration, providing and analyzing relevant and timely data, and serving as a gateway for USDA programs and other third-party funding opportunities. Over one quarter of the Center's resources will be invested in farms, ranches or food businesses who need capital to launch and expand their businesses (known as Business Builder grants).



Coordination

- Cultivate and coordinate partnerships across diverse organizations and regional initiatives
- Serve as a state/regional resource and capacity building hub for federal grants and programs

Technical Assistance

- Support diverse activities and outcomes with emphasis on value chain and coordination, scaling up small/mid-tier operations and one-on-one assistance

Capacity Building

- Implement Business Builder Awards to build capacity among under-invested operations
